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The heat is on! Summertime has arrived and it's been location where the corporation regularly accepts blazing hot with some record highs around Florida. Your legislative team is looking to turn up the heat in Tallahassee when the legislative term begins next year. We are constantly reviewing statutes that effect our industry to find changes that need to be made, or opposed when others propose them that may be detrimental to our profession or the rights of litigants.

A bill that started last year HB 103 was recently passed by the Florida Legislature regarding subpoenas. The bill was submitted by a Civil Justice Subcommittee. The bill expands the methods by which a law enforcement officer may effect service of an investigative subpoena, court order, or search warrant on an out-of-state corporation that provides electronic communication services or remote computing services. As expanded, service of the documents may be had on the corporation's registered agent under the laws of the state in which service will be effected. The bill also states that out-of-state corporations doing business in Florida through the Internet may be served at any

service.

The bill also specifies the means to enforce a subpoena on an in-state or out-of-state corporation that provides electronic communication services or remote computing services. If a corporation fails to comply with a properly-served subpoena, the bill allows a court, upon petition from the authority seeking the subpoena, to hold the non-complying corporation in indirect criminal contempt, and subject the entity to fines. If approved by the Governor, these provisions take effect July 1, 2020.

We will keep you posted on future legislative updates.


There are currently 1,590 active process server accounts that are registered to e-file through the portal.

Dear Members,

Hope all are well and have been safe while navigating the past few months. It is my honor to be the Vice-Chair for VAPS Committee. Fortunately we do not have any new cases to report.

WOW, is all I can say about the past few months and how we have all had to adapt to the pandemic and the unrest in our society. During these types of crisis defendants are most likely stressed and more likely to lash out when a process server shows up at their door. Even in the best of the times, not many people are happy to see a process server. We should all be doing our part to take extra precautions to ensure our safety.

Suggestions for serving safely for all parties:

- Be aware of your surroundings at all times
- When approaching a property after knocking do your best to maintain 6 ft from the front door (when possible) so subjects feel safe. If you are unable to maintain the 6ft rule create a safe distance between you and the subject.
- Wear a mask as recommended by the CDC
- If someone refuses to open a door advise them you do not want them to open the door but if they could please step to a window so you can point out important information.
- Document everything you have done in detail.
- Stay calm and be respectful.

This is now part of the new normal.

### National Update:

Former gubernatorial Candidate Sentenced To 32 Years in Prison. Christopher Barnett, a former gubernatorial candidate in Oklahoma, has been sentenced to 32 years in prison. Barnett shot a man who was serving him eviction papers last summer in south Tulsa, according to police. The victim was shot in the elbow as he was walking back to his vehicle. Tulsa police seized firearms and thousands of rounds of ammunition while serving a search warrant Barnett's home on July 25, 2019 -- the day after they say he shot the process server. The defendant attempted to claim a Stand your Ground argument, which the judge denied. The jury recommended Christopher Barnett to get 32 years in prison and a \$10,000 maximum fine.

### Violence Against Process Servers Update Continued

Keeping in mind safety for all, FAPPS has a designated page on our website for any process server to report violent incidents. Please share the link with your servers and associates. The more data we collect, the better opportunity we have to change legislation to protect process servers.

#### Professionalism and Courtesy Pay-Off!!

#### **Situation**

Later "Mr. Almost-Hit-n-Run" lawyer became a client of the Process Serving Firm that had served him the divorce papers.


#### **Comment**

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## PROFESSIONAL TO PROFESSIONAL Submitted by Dr. Denny Howley

When we join a professional organization, such as FAPPS, we have our own objectives, such as increasing our business with a new "visibility", net-working with likeminded folks who advocate a higher professional work ethic or maybe we just like to see our name in print.

Regardless of our initial motivation as Process Servers, once we joined FAPPS, unless we are oblivious of publications, emails and meetings, we soon come to realize that PROFESSIONAL means just that PROFESSIONAL. A group of folks who take pride in what they do, who are proud to have their name on their Return of Service and who demonstrate, on a daily basis, a high degree of people skills with clients, fellow Process Servers and those who are served.

Nonetheless, sometimes in our effort "to spin" those documents out to be served and make those dollars, we forget some of the basics that define us as PROFESSIONAL Process Servers. Obviously we mind our "manners" in dealing with our clients or the flow of business might stop. Sometimes, however, we take our fellow professionals a bit too much for granted…like assuming they completed "Mind reading 101".

Often we'll get a cover sheet/form, but it is "generic" and has EVERYTHING checked. Sure if it's a "generic" form one can check off the blocks for "instruction", but are they really for instruction if everything is checked? Sometimes it would be easier, on the "receiving end", just to have a short note.

- But to be fair some professionals who use the "generic" cover/information sheet highlight what they really want or check off those blocks that apply. Needless to say such clarification is ALWAYS appreciated.

Or one of my favorites is the Service that arrives with a check (what I look for first I must admit), but with ONLY an address on the envelope. Well as a Senior Citizen that sometimes challenges my intellectual capabilities, since I have to go to the FAPPS Directory (If I remember where I keep it), and get things like the phone number of the Process Server who sent me the documents. Of course I'm assuming they'll want me to call at some point with the status of the serve.

But not to belabor the point, remember the Golden Rule....deal with others as you would like to be dealt with. Think about those things that bug you when you receive documents and make sure you are not doing the same thing to others. Maybe even check your folks who are doing the admin bit in farming out the process to be served, to make sure they are not just "boiler plating" instructions.

The bottom line is that "instructions" should not require a Ph.D. to figure out nor should it require a lot of time or intellectual gymnastics to understand. My favorite slogan, probably 'cause I'm an old Infantryman, is "KISS = Keep it Simple Stupid". It works and helps to prevent the ruffling of feathers caused by misunderstanding and or misinterpretation.

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
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
