

Hunstein v. Preferred Collection and Management Services, Inc.

You may or may not have heard of the Hunstein case, but it has the potential to impact process servers across the nation. On April 21, 2021, in *Hunstein v. Preferred Collection and Management Services, Inc.*, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit issued a decision on a case of first impression, finding that a debt collector's transmittal of a consumer's personal information to its letter vendor constituted a prohibited third-party communication "in connection with the collection of any debt" within the meaning of section 1692c(b) of the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act ("FDCPA").

The bottom line, is that the court basically made transmittal of any information about a debtor to any outside party an improper act. Could that include an Attorney hiring a Process Server to do a "door knock", to deliver a demand letter, to even serve a summons? Clearly, that was not the intent of the FDCPA, service of legal process needs to happen.

Concerned about this development, NAPPS, decided to investigate filing a "Friend or the Court" or Amicus Curiae brief. After a good bit of discussion, the NAPPS board decided to hire Manny Newberger, who has extensive experience in the Debt Collections industry and is familiar with NAPPS as well. On June 1st, NAPPS had its "Friend of the Court" brief filed with the 11th circuit court. Hopefully they will address our traditional roles and clarify that we are not Debt Collectors, and that entrusting us with enough information to do our jobs is not a violation of the FDCPA. Look for more details on this matter and the NAPPS Brief in the next NAPPS "The Docket Sheet".

Formal Education

Dear Members,

Our education program has undergone a few significant changes over the past year. We have developed an online education program and trained several new Instructors. Our online education program class attendance is growing and we continue to receive positive feedback. We receive daily phone calls regarding our classes.

Continuing Education classes are conducted monthly and New Process Servers classes are scheduled quarterly. Additional classes have been scheduled in the fall to facilitate education of the servers in the 15th Judicial Circuit (Palm Beach) where licensing only occurs once a year. We will be teaching courses at Indian River State College September 10-12, 2021 for the servers in the 19th Judicial Circuit and plan to conduct Instructor evaluations and review/planning sessions during this weekend. In person classes in other areas around the state will be scheduled as requested.

Over the past quarter, Diana Wardwell and myself conducted a CLE presentation for the North Tampa Bar Association via Zoom on Service of Process. This was a great opportunity to share information with the attendees.

The committee goals for the year include continuing to focus our efforts on introducing our program to jurisdictions that have not already approved our courses, and to provide support and resources to the other committees in FAPPS. The committee will continue to be available to provide additional education within the legal community as requested. We will continue our dialog with the jurisdictions that have approved our program to incorporate any specific information they request shared in our classes. An Educational Forum

A Good Serve or Not?

Situation

The case involved a scooter accident here in Key West. The "Scooter Ride Company" was to be sued by serving the Registered Agent, Alibaba. A brief check of the Criss-Cross Directory and White Pages confirmed the address provided for the serve as a private home. After several attempts, the Server finally found someone home, but he was not particularly helpful. He and "friend" had been living at that address for over six months, it was a rental property. He knew Alibaba was the owner, but stated Alibaba had moved to Miami. The renter was unwilling to provide any information on Alibaba's physical address in Miami or how he paid his rental check. The client was notified and the Server was instructed to hold the documents while they did another "skip-trace".

<u>Bingo !</u>

Several days later the Server was given a new address, an apartment number in a large apartment/ condo complex also in Key West. Again, he did his Criss-Cross Directory and White Pages pre-Serve check, which only indicated the initial address...NO INFORMATION on the newly provided apartment. So the mental "war-gaming", in anticipation of a "blind-Serve" began. The key element always being, the Server had to confirm that Alibaba lived or did not live at that unit. And if in fact Alibaba lived there, our Server needed a "legal serve-scenario" that would satisfy his client and the court, if the case proceeded that far.

Why Server's MUST ALWAYS THINK !

Our FAPPS Professional arrived at the unit; he found the front door set back in a little alcove, with a blank wall to the right of the door and a small window to the left. The window had a shutter, which was partially closed, but gave a limited view of the floor and stove in the apartment's kitchen. Our Server knocked and a woman answered "who's there?" He said "is Alibaba home". She called "Ali", and the Server heard a muffled reply. Then she said to the Server, standing on the other side of the closed door, "he's in the bathroom, I'll get him". A short time later she returned and asked, "who are you?" Our Server said "Denny, I have some documents for Ali". It then sounded like the young woman returned to the rear of the unit to pass this information on to Alibaba.



When she returned, she sat on the kitchen floor, after apparently conferring with Ali. Our Server glimpsed her, through the partially closed blinds in the alcove, sitting on the kitchen floor. She seemed to be sorting some small items, but totally ignored the waiting Server on the other side of the door. Our Server knocked on the door again and asked for Ali, but she continued to sit on the floor. Finally she said, without moving, "call him on the phone". After several more door-knocking attempts and asking politely for Ali, Our Server said "I'm process server Denny Howley, please tell Ali he is served as Registered Agent for the Scooter Ride Company. Ma'am I'm leaving the documents here in front of your door. Sorry to have bothered you", and departed.

The conversation confirmed that Alibaba, called "Ali" by his lady friend and probably other close associates, did in fact live at the address provided. The serve scenario was reviewed with the attorney client who requested a detailed affidavit. The client was satisfied with the description of the "servescenario" of the known avoider and nothing more was heard on the case.

The material for "A Good Serve or Not" was provided by Dr. Denny Howley, 305 294 5568 serving Key West, Capital of the Conch Republic. The story shows once again the importance of pre-planning for a serve and that the Process Serving business is a "**be prepared**", **thinking business :-)**

Thoughts - An Educational Forum Submitted by Dr. Denny Howley

CUSTOMER SERVICE – You've Got to Be Kidding!!!

Yaaa right! Be polite to the client – sure...they pay my bills. But to the people I serve? Hey guy I'm not the Walmart Greeter. I nail those defendants, no time to play wordy "nicey" games with them. Gotta move, get them served, on to the next serve... I mean time is money.

BUT

<u>PROFESSIONALS</u> have self-imposed standards which they try to live by in dealing with clients, others in the profession, servers and defendants.

Unfortunately, the majority of Process Servers in Florida do not belong to any professional organization and many run with only the short range and narrow "money" perspective. Long range growth, in any profession, depends on CUSTOMER SERVICE and PERFORMANCE.

Any time a PROFESSIONAL has the opportunity to re-evaluate their business practices they grab it. And any time a PROFESSIONAL can "borrow" customer service practices from ANY business entity they do so.

Here's a modified "Code of Service" I borrowed from a major business chain that I felt might be useful to us as Process Service business operators.

1. IMAGE

As a Process Server, whether Sheriff or Court appointed, we REPRESENT THE ENTIRE INDUSTRY. The impression we leave with all parties we come in contact with will be a STANDARD which they will measure the entire SERVICE OF PROCESS PROFESSION. They will remember how they were treated in their conversation over the phone and/or in person.

Were we always respectful and professional? Did we reflect empathy, in explaining the document and generally helping the defendant understand what was happening by being "served"? Politeness and courtesy go a long way, regardless of whether it is reciprocated or not. Were we dressed "appropriately" for the "serving" environment? i.e. in Key West my attire aims at "blending-in" and being "non-threatening", Thus tank tops, t-shirts, shorts and always my red headband. Bottom line is a server MUST know her/his environment and package him/herself accordingly.

2. PERSONALIZED" SERVICE

Obviously we MUST review and be able to explain, basically, the documents we are serving. But there is also a crucial "people skill" involved here as well ," treat others as you would like to be treated". If you have a serve that you know they do not want, wish went somewhere else and they "THANK YOU" as you are leaving, you know you have rated high on the people-skill scale.

3. OWNERSHIP AND "FUN"

As human beings, we are responsible for our actions, attitudes and how we CHOOSE to deal with others. As PROFESSIONALS, that acceptance is imperative. Sure, we like the money, BUT do we like serving Process? Do we enjoy interacting with others, even when the situation might get a bit "dicey"? If we don't enjoy what the Service of Process entails, then maybe we should look for another more suitable line of work.

Dear Members,

Our legislative team constructed a bill last year with several changes, clarifications, and even some new statutes to help aid us all in the process serving field. Our bill was sponsored by Senator Ana Maria Rodriguez, and titled SB1420. After being filed February 18, 2021, it was referred to Judiciary on February 24, 2021, and then introduced to the Senate Judiciary committee on March 2, 2021.

Unfortunately, because of other matters consuming the legislative session, our bill died in Judiciary on April 30, 2021. While this means we didn't get it passed this year, we are confident and moving forward with the same bill for our next session. Again, I would like to thank all those members of our team, and our lobbyist for all the time and efforts in getting this bill put together.

Violence Against Process Servers

Dear Members,

It is hard to believe we are halfway through 2021! I believe we all need to give ourselves and others a high five, pat on the back and an award for quickly adapting to keep our profession moving forward in the face of adversity. It was not always easy, but we did it, not only personally but as an association. There have been so many that reached out to members just to check in and say hi, offer a hand or words of encouragement. This is what defines us as a great association.

We are still following the case in Hillsborough County from July 2020 when a server was threatened and had a gun pointed at him while trying to serve a family related document. The current pending charges against him are, Obstruction of Justice with Violence (Third Degree Felony), Assault with a Deadly Weapon (Third Degree Felony) and Criminal Mischief (Second Degree Misdemeanor). This is set for a pretrial hearing June 22nd and a Jury Trial has been set for June 28th. I am checking with court personnel to see if the trial is held via Zoom if I may log on as a guest so we have real-time updates and verdicts for the case.

The goal of this committee is to assist process server in our state who have experience violence including but not limited to assault, battery, threats, or a victim of violence in any way, while exercising their duties legally as a process server. We are here to support process server in any way possible with navigating the process with the courts and local jurisdictions and to document such incidents, so problem subjects, areas, or procedures can be shared with other process servers. The date we gather can be later used to promote better legislation to assist and protect our profession in the future.

I want to welcome Tammy White who has volunteered to be the liaison in Southwest Florida and be a point of contact to assist with violence reports in her area. Tammy has been a member of the VAPS committee for the past several years as well as a volunteer for several other FAPPS committees, I know her desire to better our profession is going to be an asset to VAPS. If you are interested in volunteering to be a liaison for VAPS please reach out to myself or our Vice-Chair Chris Yeoman. Earlier this month VAPS Vice Chair Chris Yeoman met with the deputy chief of Coral Springs Police Department along with another Broward Process Server. The purpose of this meeting was to review a case from last year where this Process Server was attacked by a defendant after serving her with documents. There was an arrest made the following day after the attack, and charges were filed by the state attorneys office. Unfortunately with Covid last year, the trial was delayed multiple times and the prosecuting attorney changed hands a few times as well. at the time of trial the state attorney elected not to call the responding police officers as witnesses, and only the victim was called to testify, and a jury elected to find the defendant not guilty. our conclusion after the discussion was that this was a failure of the system, the officers were ready to testify, the state attorney seems to have dropped the ball.

Our meeting however was not without the progress. The deputy chief was responsive to our concerns regarding violent attacks and threats against Process Servers while executing our duties, as well as the lack of support from law-enforcement when called for these incidents. We further agreed a solution might be to allow us to speak in front of his officers and discuss the Process Server's duties, rights, and obligations in executing legal process, as well as the specific laws that are there to protect us. The deputy chief then invited Chris Yeoman to return at a later date to be determined to discuss these very concerns amongst his department officers. We will provide a further update as this discussion continues.

We look forward to seeing all of you at The Professional Beach Getaway in August. We will have a great round table discussion regarding safety and de-escalation practices for servers. 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


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
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Process Server's Toolbox
